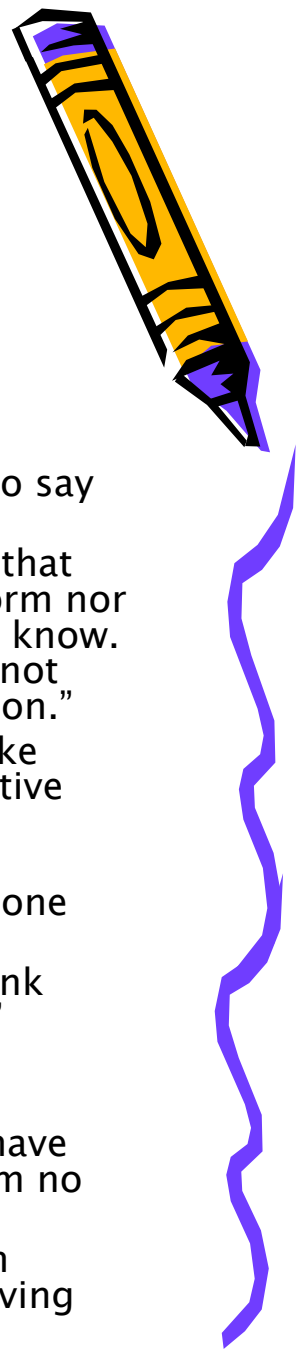


Comparing skills/knowledge for the 21st Century To What the Arts Teach
